# BIRMINGHAM PROUDLY HOSTS THE 2022 COMMONWEALTH GAMES MARATHON

The Marathon will be staged on roads in the heart of Birmingham, celebrating the city's rich history and culture. The course is made up of two sections. An 18km loop, starting from Smithfield heading south out of the city towards Bournville. Then a 6.2km stretch through the city centre, finishing in Victoria Square. Both elite athletes and para-athletes will compete in the Marathon.

More than one million people from across the globe are expected to travel to the region to enjoy not only the sporting events, but everything else it has to offer. This means there will be more people than usual travelling on our roads and using public transport.



# **Change to traffic conditions**

Changed traffic conditions will be in place for the following roads between 2:30am – 3:30pm. Please plan ahead, be patient and follow directions from the Police and Traffic Management Teams.

A38 / Belgrave Interchange	Changed Traffic Conditions	No access to Belgrave Interchange (A441) from the Bristol Road (A38). No access to Belgrave Interchange (A441) from Ring Road (A4540) clockwise
Pershore Road (A441) between Belgrave Interchange to Cartland Road	Limited Access	No access north on Pershore Road (A441) beyond Cartland Road. Access to and from Cartland Road to Pershore Road (A441) southbound and vice versa only
Navigation Street	Limited Access	Access will be maintained along Navigation Street for businesses until 07:30 on the morning of Saturday 30 July.

# **Residential access**

There will be vehicle crossing points under Police and Traffic Control between **2.30am – 6.15am** and **1.30pm – 3.30pm** on the following roads.

Sir John's Road	Access will be facilitated through the road closure on Pershore Road (A441) for residents to access Oakfield Road.
Milner Road / Dogpool Lane	Access will be facilitated through the road closure for residents to access Dogpool Lane.
Umberslade Road	Access will be facilitated along Umberslade Road through the road closures on Ribblesdale Road and Raddlesbarn Road for residents only.
Regent Street & Oxford Street	Access will be facilitated through the road closures on Bournville Lane onto Victoria Road for residents only
Heath Road between Woodlands Park Road and Hawthorne Road	Access will be facilitated through the road closures on Woodlands Park Road onto Heath Road for residents only.
Mulberry Road between Hay Green Lane and Woodlands Park Road	Access will be facilitated through the road closures on Woodlands Park Road onto Mulberry Road for residents only.
Teazel Avenue	Access will be facilitated through the road closures on Bournville Lane onto Cedar Road for residents only.
Laburnum Road	Access will be facilitated through the road closures on Willow Road onto Acacia Road for residents only.
Gristhorpe Road	Access will be facilitated through the road closures on Raddlebarn Road onto Hurbert Road for residents only.
Graham Street (Jewellery Quarter)	Access will be facilitated south only through the road closures George Street onto Newhall Street for residents only.

#### **Public transport**

Some bus services will need to be diverted, temporarily suspended or will terminate earlier than usual due to road closures. Some stops may also be temporarily relocated.

Check the journey planner or with your operator for real time travel information. Metro services will also terminate at Grand Central.

#### **Bike hire and e-scooters**

Due to the road closures and expected crowds around the Marathon route, some cycle hire docks and e-scooter parking zones may be suspended within the event zone from 2.30am until 3.30pm on Saturday 30 July.

Please monitor the respective apps to find your nearest live dock or parking zone.

# Helping pedestrians cross the course

Pedestrian crossing points are located along the event route. Marshals will help pedestrians cross the course. Usual crossings may be suspended, but an alternative will be signposted where it will be easier to cross. Please be patient during the event and listen to instructions given by marshals.

#### Parking

Parking will be restricted along the entire Marathon course from 6pm on Friday 29 July until 4pm on Saturday 30 July. Any vehicles left on the course will be removed.

#### Clean air zone

The clean air zone will remain operational throughout the entirety of the Commonwealth Games.

#### **Emergency services**

Emergencies will be treated as a priority in the usual way. If you require the emergency services, call 999. Emergency vehicle access will be maintained and prioritised throughout the event.

#### On the day

There will be traffic marshals and volunteers positioned along the route. If you require assistance on the day that is not a 999 emergency, please ask event staff for help.

There are lots of great places to watch the Marathon and get involved in the Birmingham 2022 Commonwealth Games.


Here are some top tips on the best places to watch the Marathon:

- The course is split into two parts. The city centre start at Smithfield and the finish at Victoria Square, which are both likely to be very popular viewing locations, and the southern loop towards Stirchley and Bournville where you will get to see the competitors complete this section twice.
- Spread out along the route to cheer on your favourites
- Remember Edgbaston will also be very busy with the Cricket T20 matches in play at the same time









